Also the cell regularly organises the mock interview programmes as per the need of the students. IQAC encourages the students to participate in various activities.

The students are interested to appear for the competitive examination and to enter into the Civil Services. So, the lectures were arranged for the preparation of competitive examination. The students were guided to enrol in campus interviews arranged by the university and various companies. The Placement Cell and the Department of Botany had organised campus interview for Nath Bio-Genes (I) Ltd., Aurangabad conducted on 24/02/2015 in the college. 30 students had attended the interview and 15 were selected for the different positions. 54 students were sent to attend the campus interview conducted by Infosys at NMU Jalgaon on 22/01/2015. For the SC, ST and OBC category students the National Commission of SC, arranged seminar cum interview programme for entry in Airline Industries on 02/03/2015 at Thakur College, Kandivali (E), Mumbai. Four students were sent to attend the same. Coaching for the sports are given to the students and many students have participated in University, State and National level sports and games.
