


Criterion – V 5. Student Support and Progression

One day workshop was arranged on competitive examination on 07/01/2016 in the college. Total 150 students had participated in the workshop. Free coaching for various competitive examinations is provided to the students by the Spectrum Academy, Jalgaon. 50 students are getting benefit of this coaching. By arranging various activities, the faculties track the traits of the students in various areas.


5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)
